- Co-Presidents // Pedro Craveiro & Felicity Stone-Richards
 - Updates from Chancellor's Committee on Budget: UCSB is running \$50 million structural deficit, they are discussing what kinds of budgetary savings can be made without significant cuts to academic services.
 - The Committee will use one-time funds from the state to cover the whole deficit this year, but over the next few months will be discussing how to address the recurring \$25 million ongoing deficit.
 - The deficit is the result of multiple factors including payroll increases, salary and benefit increases, covid shutdown loss of income, previous withdrawal of state funds

 - Health Insurance:
 - Next year, health insurance premiums for grads will be fully decoupled from undergrads; this means that we are taking a <u>big</u> increase to our rates. We are currently trying to brainstorm ways to decrease premiums in the future without losing coverage
 - STI home-test kits and full body laser hair removal for gender affirming care will be covered by our insurance starting next plan year
 - Housing:
 - Next meeting is tomorrow; I'll get a better sense of how we are doing for Fall 2022

- Vice President of External Affairs // Heather Prentice-Waltz
 - UC Student Lobbying Trip UPDATES:
 - Legislative Liaison Anne Berry is currently representing UCSB in Washington DC; working with UCGPC team to meet with congressional representatives
 - Lobbying efforts include:
 - supporting AB 1602 Student, faculty and staff housing: California student housing revolving loan fund act
 - supporting H. Con. Res. 19 Urging the establishment of a US commission on truth, racial healing, and transformation
 - supporting Climate Corporate Accountability Act

- Two items to vote on later:
 - Increase grad student lock-in fees by \$1 (\$.143 in total) to add to childcare grants
 - Increase amount of money allocated per travel grant to \$400
- Travel grants:
 - Advantage: Higher amount per student
 - **Disadvantage:** With increase in in-person conferences, increase may lead to fewer students receiving a grant in the next year or so once the surplus is eliminated
