Robert's Rules of Order Motion Steps

- 1. Motion: A member rises or raises a hand to signal the chairperson. "I move to..." for approving, adjourning
- 2. Second: Another member seconds the motion. "Second!" or "I second the motion"
- 3. Restate motion: The chairperson restates the motion.
- 4. Debate: The members debate the motion.
- 5. Vote: The chairperson restates the motion, and then first asks for affirmative votes, and then negative votes. "All in favor? Opposed? Abstaining?"
- 6. Announce the vote: The chairperson announces the result of the vote and any instructions.



Friday Noon Seminar (FNS) GSA Funding Proposal

What: Weekly seminar (based on presenter availability) for research progress presentations by advanced PhD students. A student-led space fostering grad student collaboration and community.

Who: MCDB and BMSE graduate students (no faculty, department officials, or undergraduates).

Cost: Weekly lunch (~\$250 each), department quarterly funding was abruptly cut from \$4500 to \$2000 this quarter

Funding request: \$300 toward lunch to help alleviate the sudden, drastic budget cut

Information about Co-Sponsorships

The GSA has limited funding available to support organizations' events and conferences that serve graduate students.

- \$300 per quarter per graduate student organization
- \$600 per year per graduate student organization
